Required text: *Golosa*, A Basic Course in Russian, 3d ed, Books 1 and 2. Both sets consist of a textbook and a workbook. We will use chapters 7-10 of Book 1 and chapters 1-2 of Book 2 in class.

Description: This course will continue to teach the basics of Russian grammar while emphasizing the acquisition of reading, listening, and speaking skills by the student.

Prerequisite: Rus 101

Goals: Students will learn the basics of the Russian case and verb systems and achieve active use of the language at a basic level.

Requirements: There will be a departmental exam after each unit. There will be no make-up exams except in very rare circumstances.

Please, be reminded that the syllabus provides a general outline for the course. Any deviations will be announced in class. That's why it's important to be in class every time. Attendance is required and will be recorded. Poor attendance will be reflected in your grade: five absences will reduce your grade by a third (i.e., a plus/minus) and ten absences will reduce your grade by a full letter.
